The mission of the Department of English at Texas Southern University is to teach literature and language at the level of the core curriculum for all undergraduates and at the baccalaureate level for majors and minors. Through its courses and programs, the Department of English aims to equip students to succeed in academic endeavors in college as well as graduate and professional schools and to prepare them to assume responsible roles in society.

### Goal

To provide students with an historical survey of literature and literary theory, with an emphasis on British, American, or African American works. The objective is for Students to demonstrate a historical knowledge of literature and literary theory. The target is for at least 75%.

### Outcome 1.1 – Students will demonstrate a historical knowledge of literature and literary theory

The success of this outcome will be measured by passing rates on thesis and oral assessments locally developed. Targets for the three-year period 2007-2008 through 2009-2010 are that at least 75% of students will pass the thesis and oral assessment.

#### Findings (2008-2010)

The target for this student learning outcome was met for each of the three years with 100% of students in each year passing a written comprehensive assessment on a locally prepared examination.

• Monitor courses offered in these areas to identify potential issues prior to student taking comprehensive assessment.

• Continue to emphasis on excellence in the areas of British, American, and African American works in order to provide students with historical knowledge in their respective areas.

• Review curriculum content in British, American, and African American literature to ensure relevant historical knowledge is present as is literary theory.
