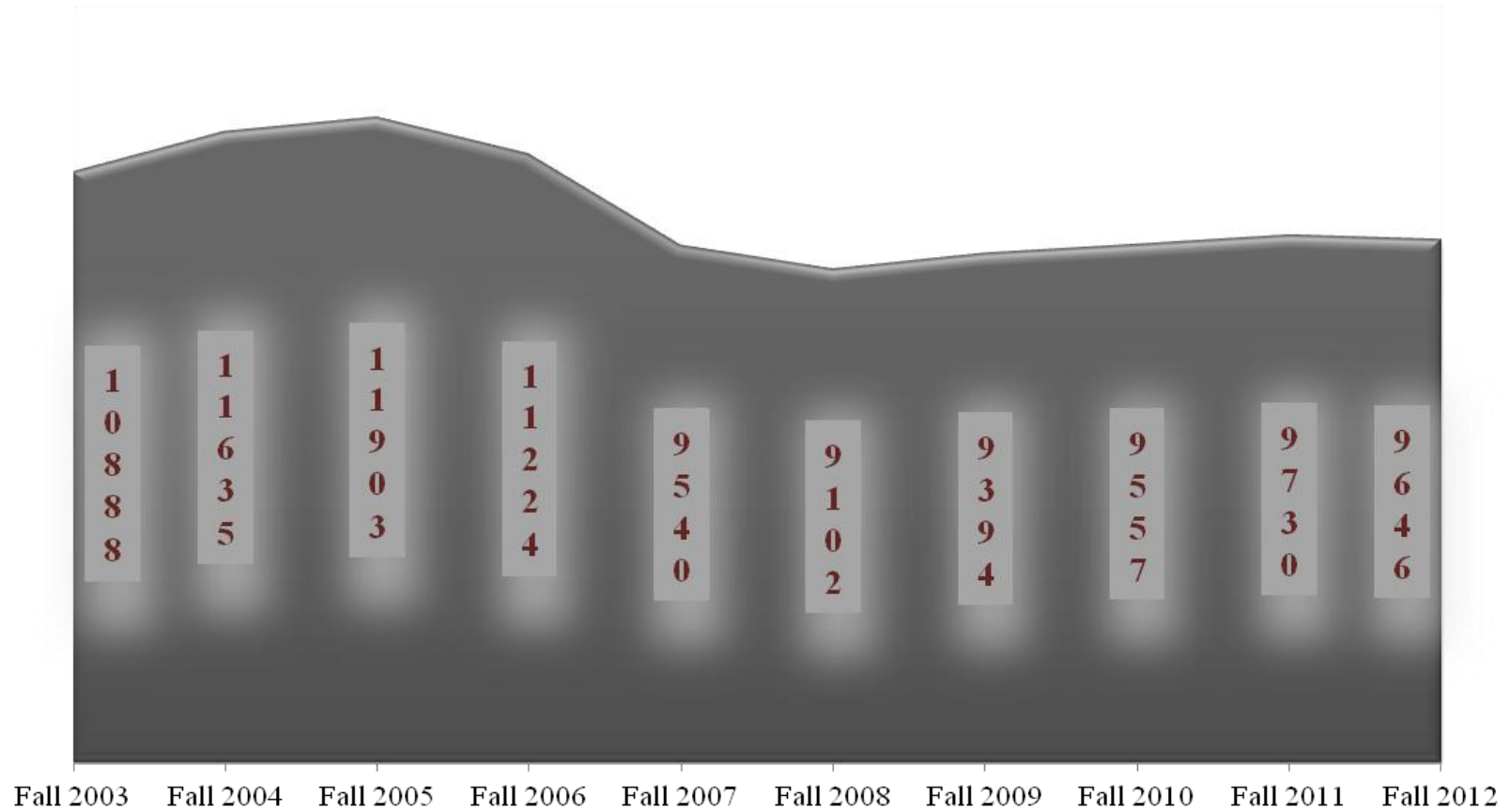

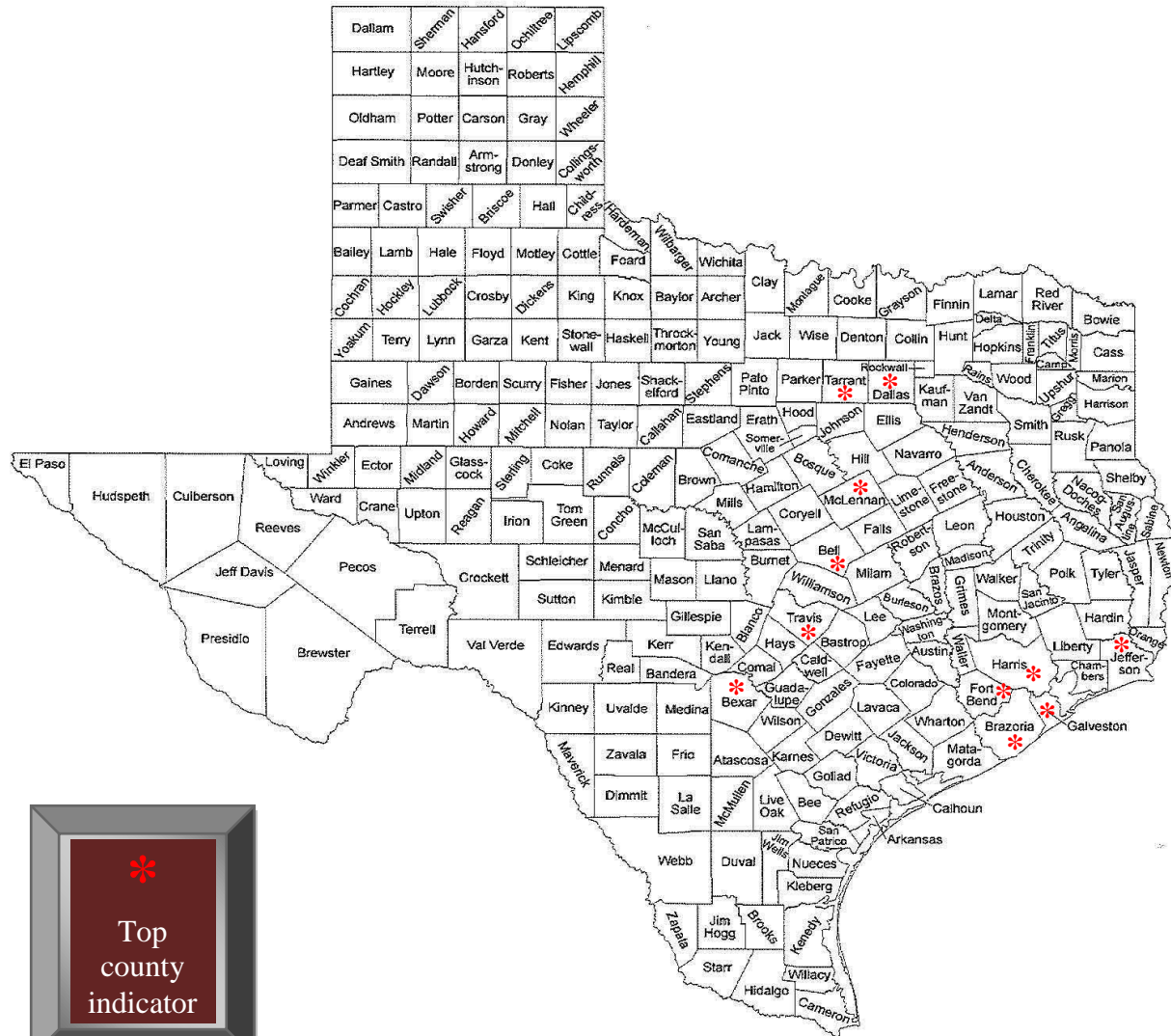

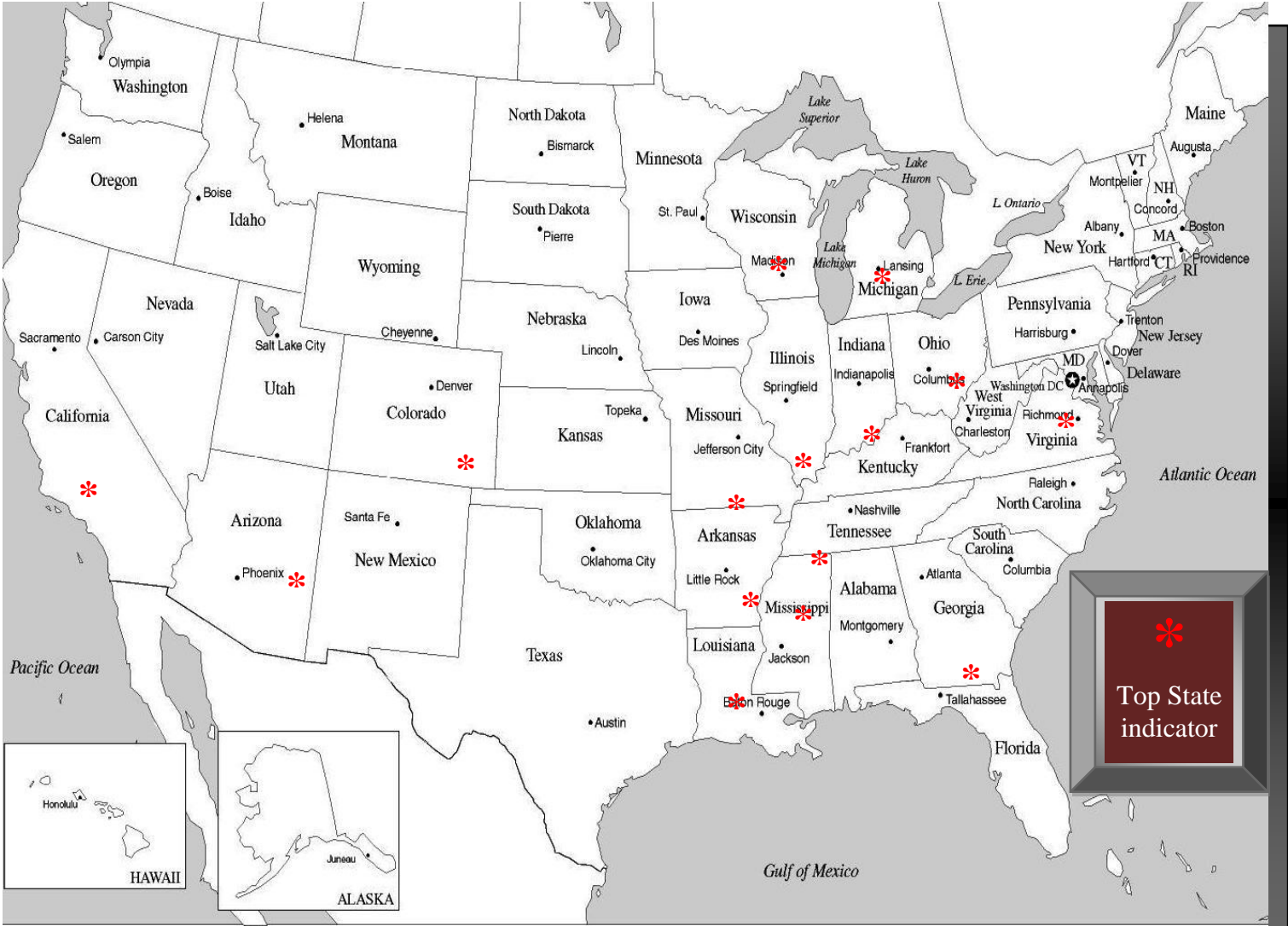

**FIRST-TIME FRESHMEN FOREIGN ENROLLMENT: FOREIGN AREAS**

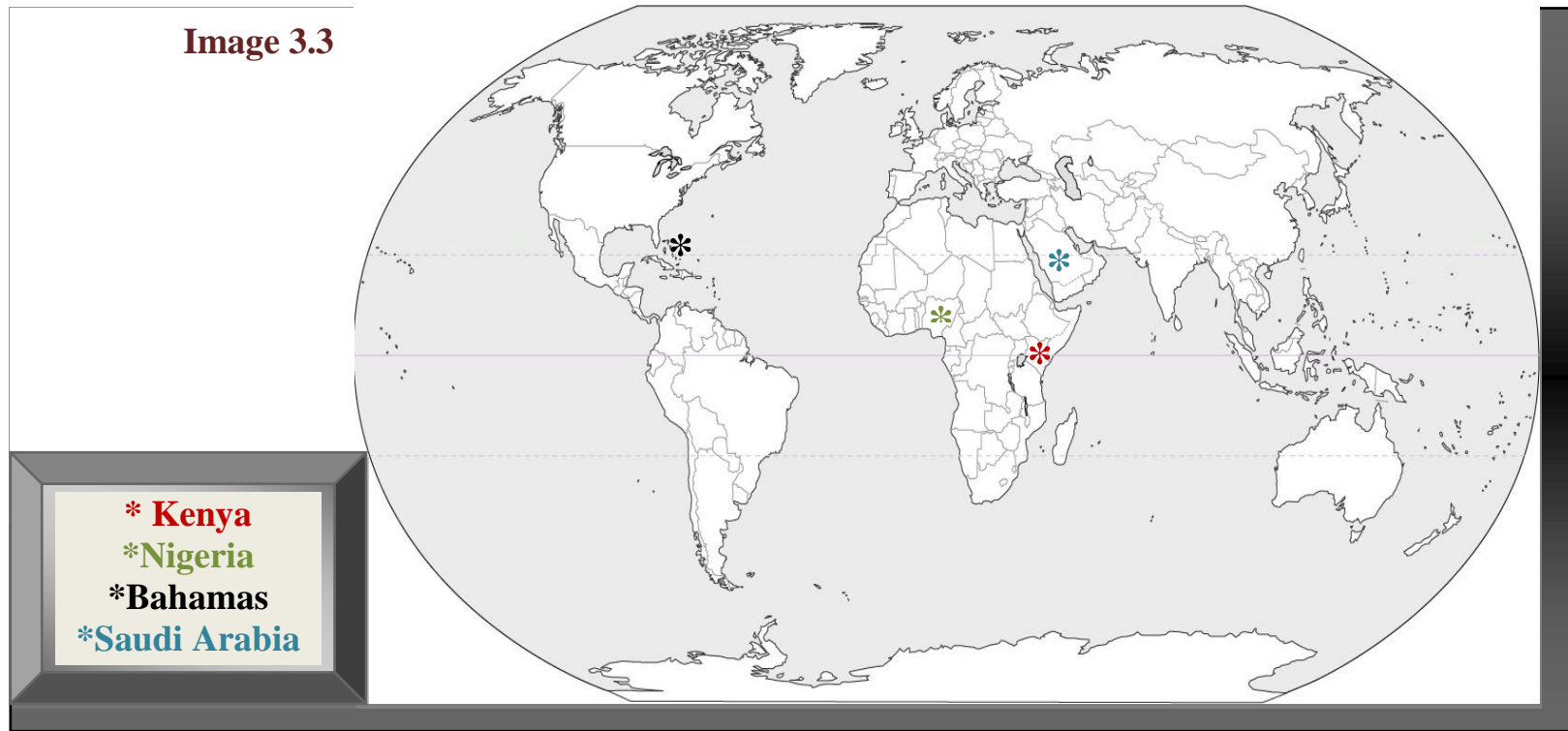

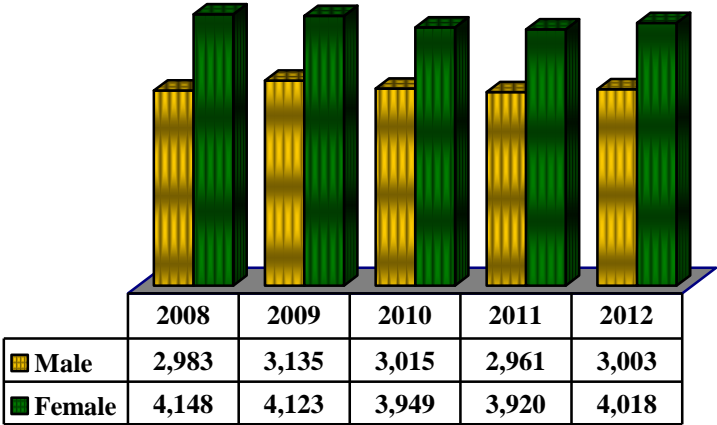

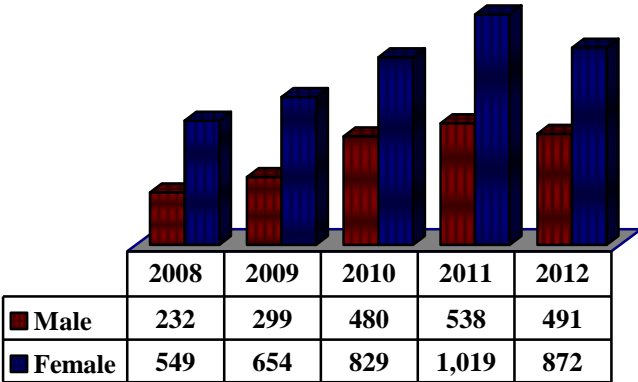

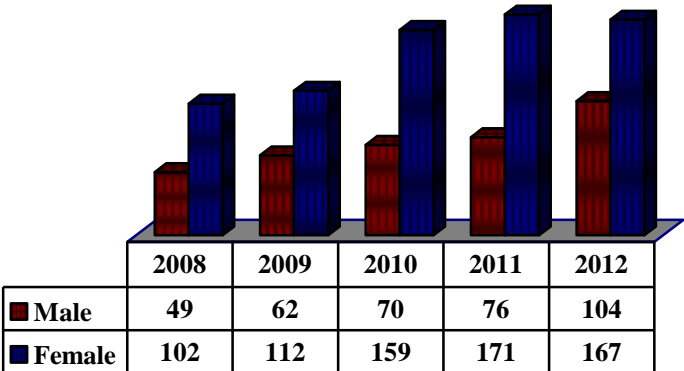
**Figure 5.1 Undergraduate**



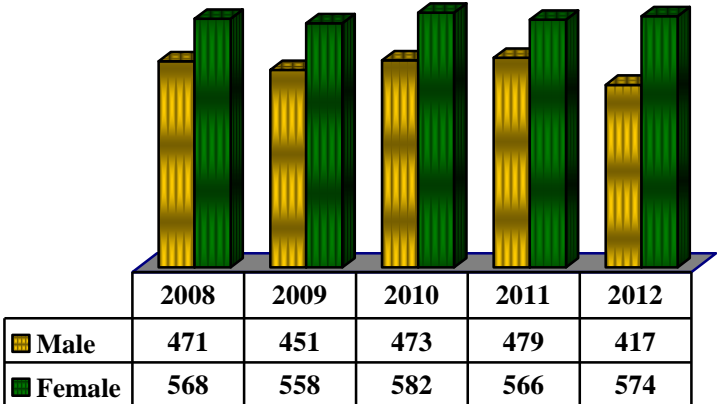
**Figure 5.2 Master's**

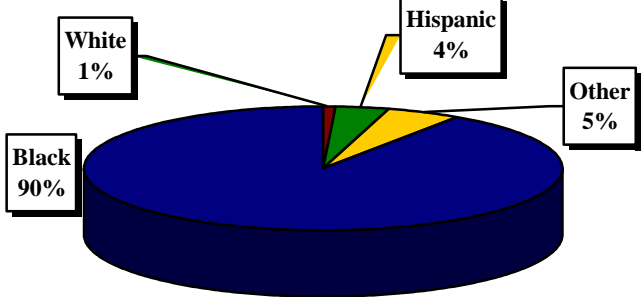
**Figure 5.4 Professional**



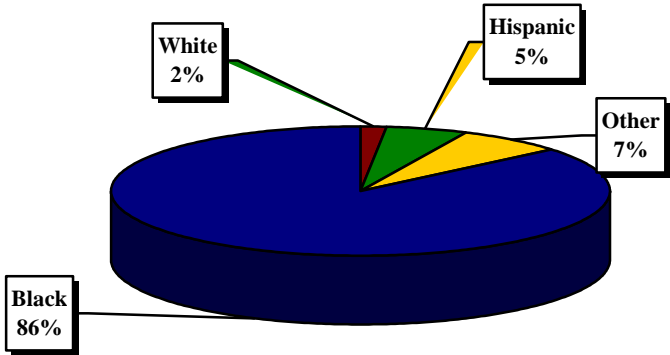
**STUDENT ENROLLMENT: ETHNICITY BY LEVEL

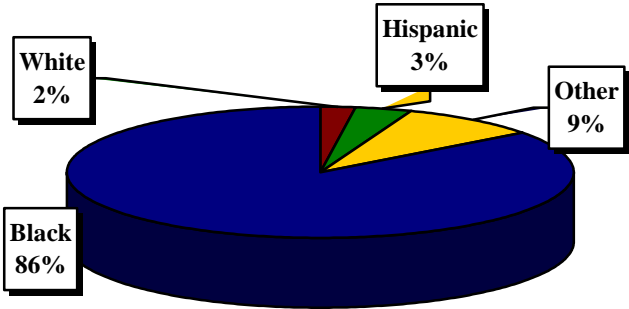


**Figure 5.6 Fall 2012**

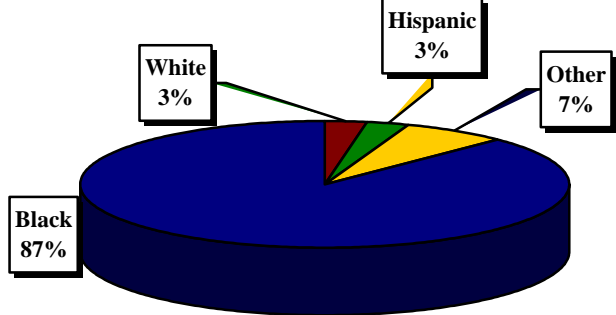

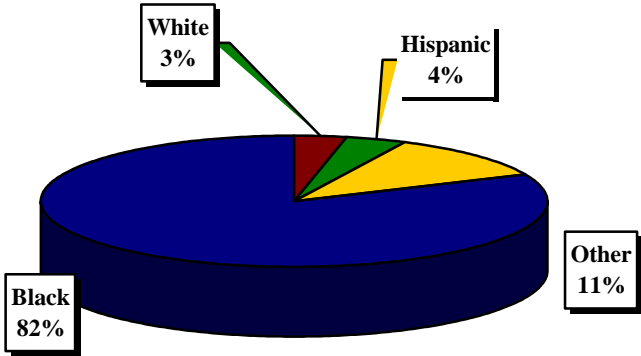
**Figure 5.8 Fall 2012**



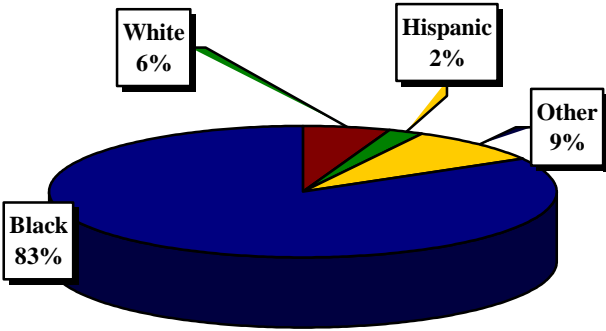

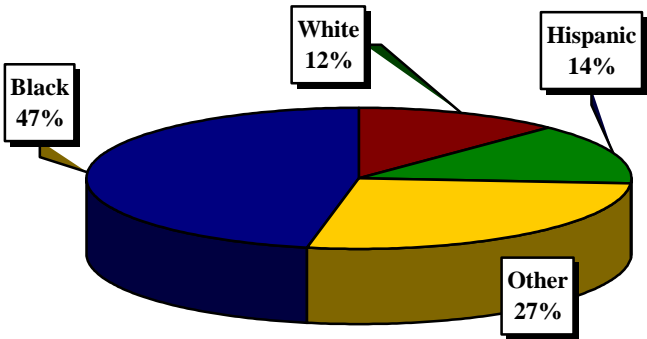


**Figure 5.10 Fall 2012**

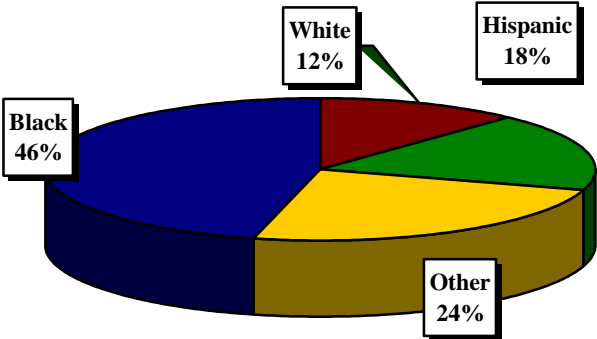

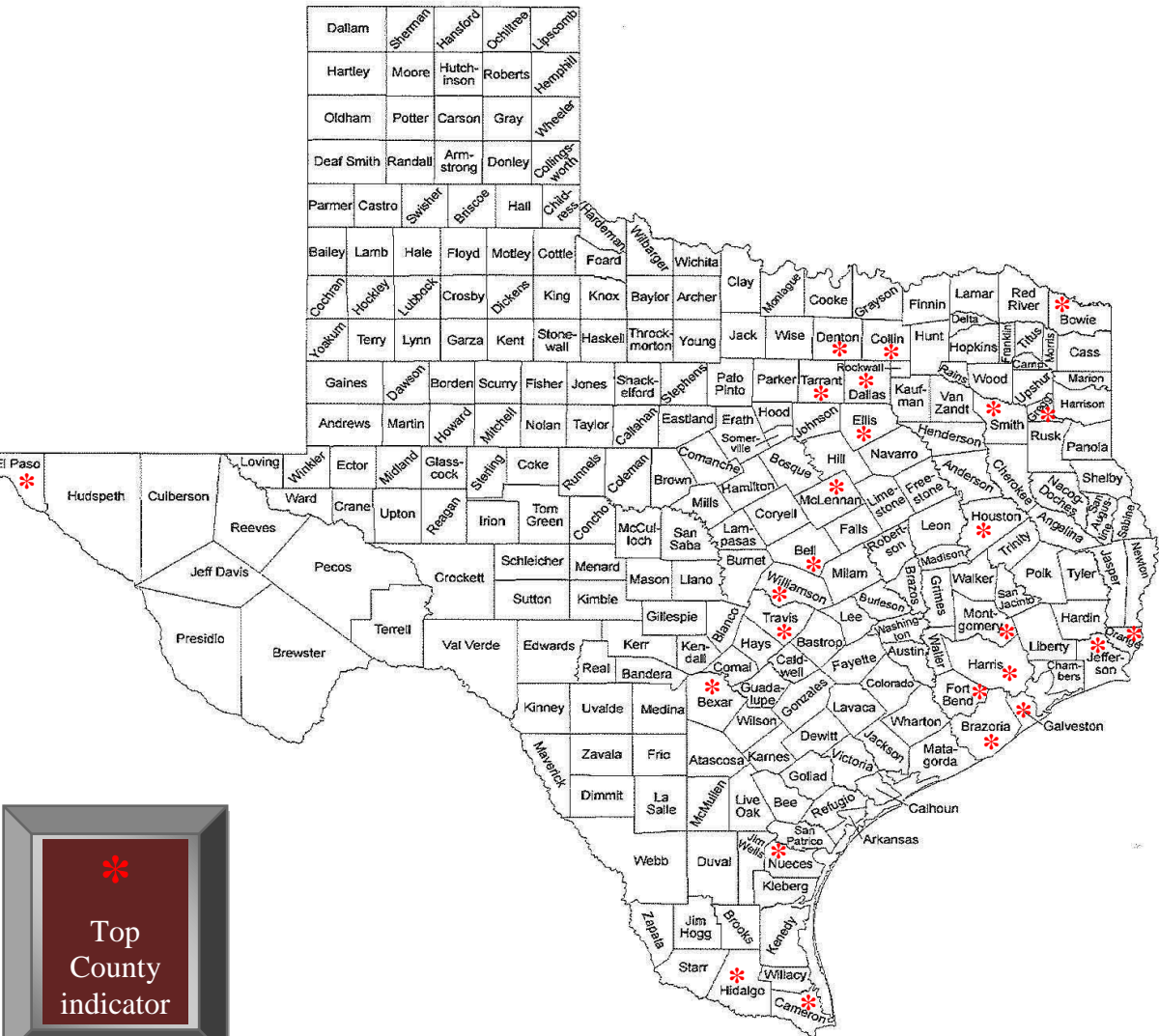

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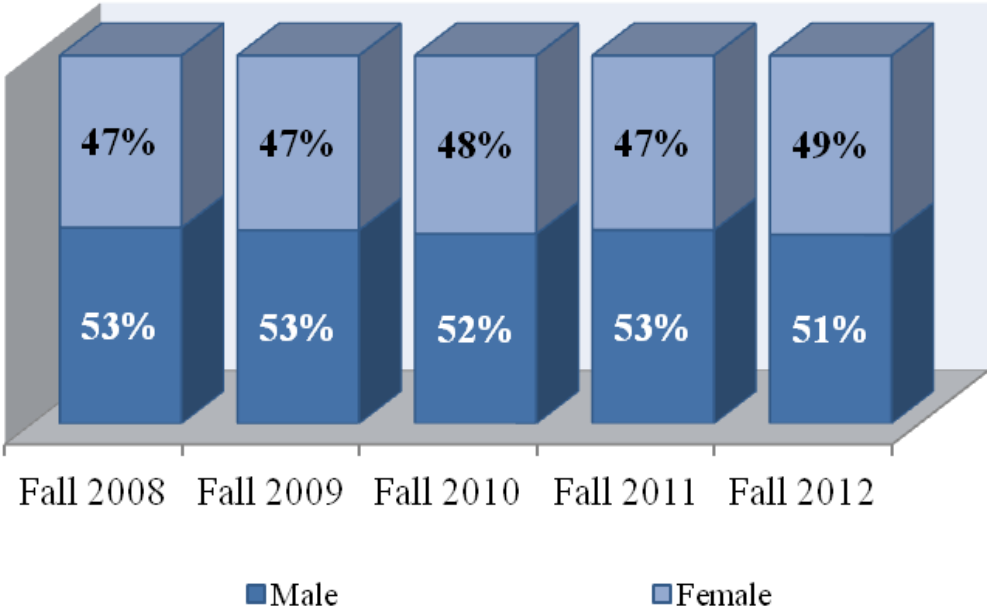

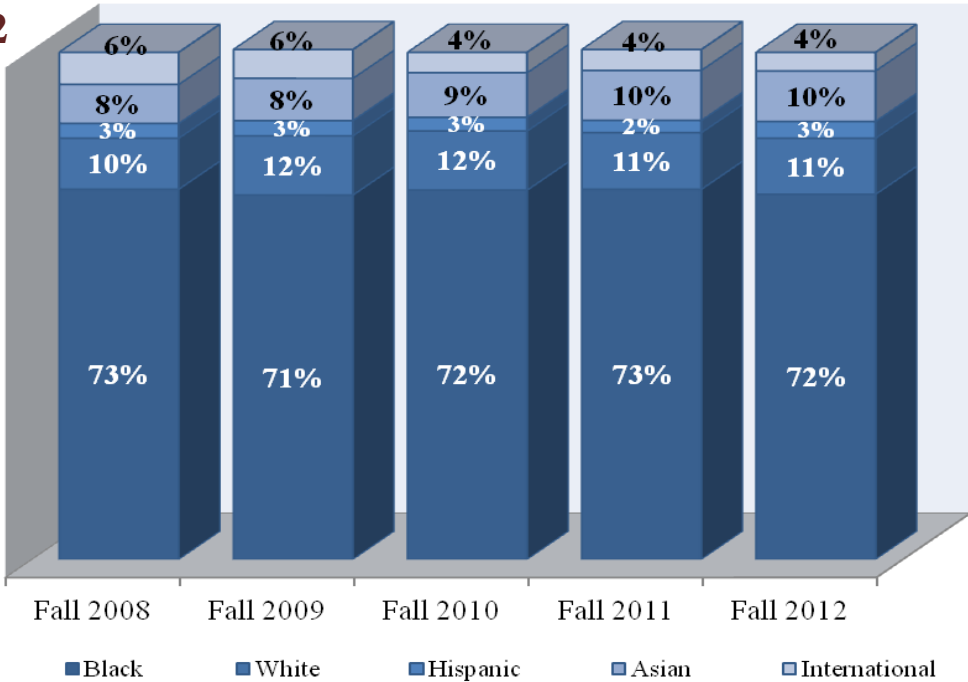
**Figure 10.1**

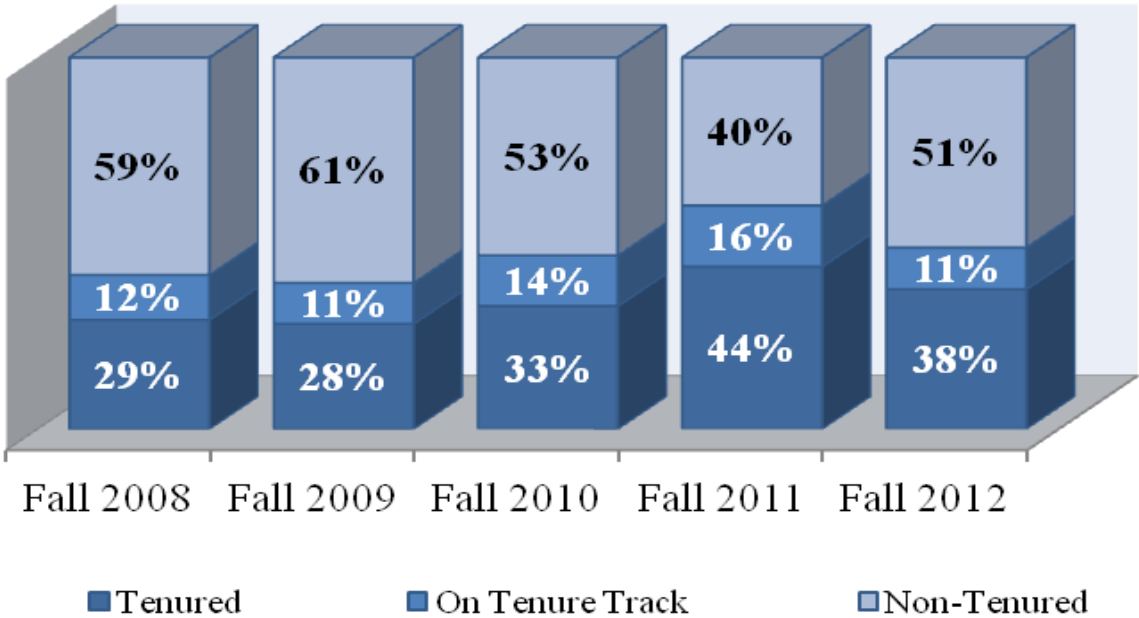
**Figure 10.2**

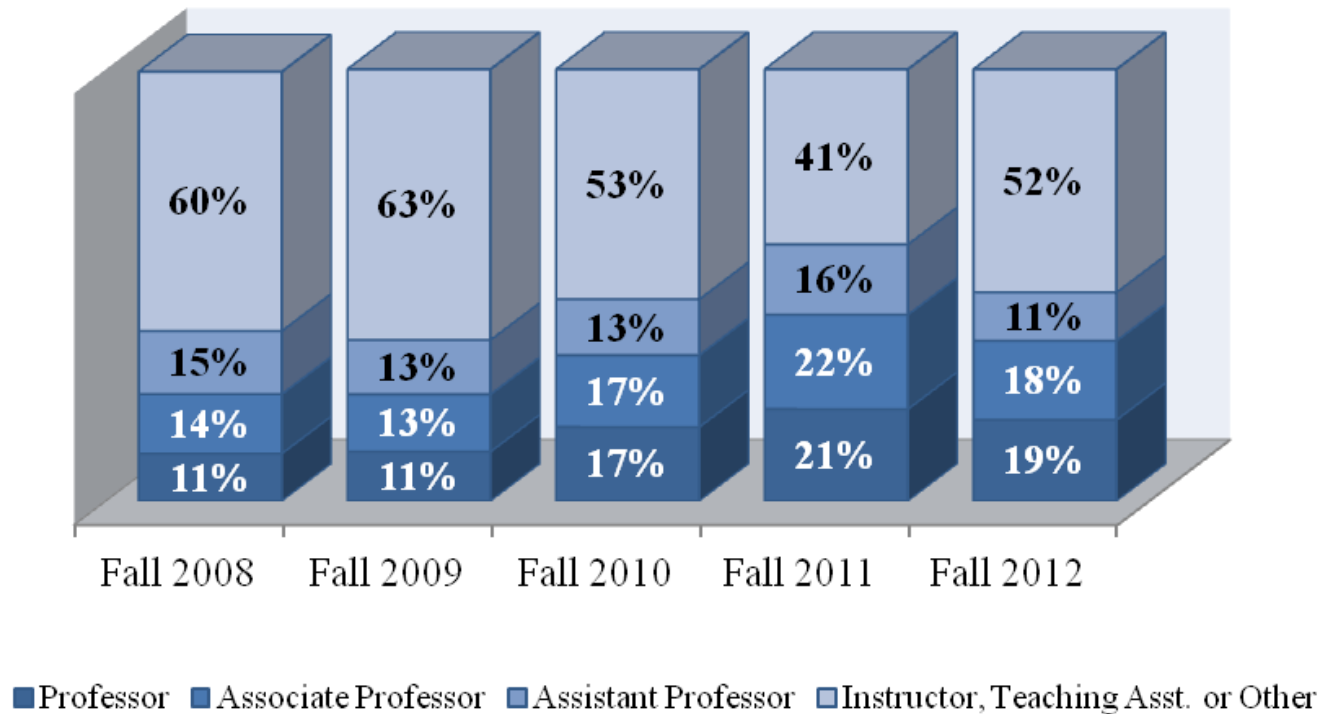
**Figure 10.3**
