#### **Honors College Scholars Victorious In NAAAHP's Debate Competition**

The "power" team of Marcus Esther, Tiffany Massey and Marshaun Williams, three Honors College scholars and TSU Debate Team members, won the "finals" in the debate competition at the 21st Annual Conference of the National Association of African-American Honors Programs in October.

The success of team members came after weeks of preparation under TSU Debate Team Coach Dr. Thomas F. Freeman, as well as guidance from the Honors College Assistant Dean for Student Services, Dr. Candy Ratliff.

The topic was: "Resolved - States should repeal all 'Stand Your Ground' laws that remove a person's duty to retreat from an assailant and instead allow the use of deadly force if reasonably threatened."

HBCUs Claflin University and South Carolina State University convened the conference in their "home town" of Orangeburg, SC.

#### Scholars Enhance Preparation at Institute, Fair, and Conference of Thurgood Marshall College Fund

The Thomas F. Freeman Honors College was represented by six advanced scholars at the 12th Annual Thurgood Marshall College Fund Leadership Institute, Recruitment Fair and Conference in New York in October.

The six included London Maclin, Trevor Milton, Elzary Asberry, Divania Sykes, Chinonso Ezeudu, and Erik Granados (since then, graduated).

The Thurgood Marshall College Fund event provides a premier recruitment opportunity for students in public HBCUs.

The four-day event allows talented future leaders to meet some of the nation's top executives and other individuals in the corporate, education and government fields.

Students participated in interactive discussions and workshops designed to provide leadership training, career management, life skills development, and recruitment opportunities.

#### Dean's Message: On the New Curriculum

The Thomas F. Freeman Honors College is entering a new and important phase in the evolution of its academic program.

In this phase, students who entered the College in or after Fall 2011 have to take four 300-level and 400-level courses (three within their majors and one outside their majors) that are augmented with College themes.

The courses will be subjects of agreements that are between the students and their instructors and that must receive approval from the College.

The implementation of this requirement follows the nod the curriculum received from the University Curriculum Council at TSU last school year.

It bears in mind the fact that new students may have entered the College as freshmen, sophomores or juniors in or after the fall semester of 2011.

### Visiting Minister Connects His Work, College Themes

The Honors College in October hosted Hon. Alva Baptiste, the Minister of Foreign Affairs, International Trade and Civil Aviation in Saint Lucia in the Eastern Caribbean.

Hon. Baptiste told students in the College and in the Department of Aviation Science and Technology that he had responsibilities at the local level (for example, helping develop tourism in his district), the national level (administering the affairs of Saint Lucia in civil aviation and other areas), and the global level (representing his nation in such organizations as the United Nations and the Organization of American States).

In this way, he connected his work to the Local/National/Global theme in the Honors College. The theme stresses the simultaneous location of subjects - for example ideas, people, services, organizations, and even attributes - within local, national and global contexts.

The Minister also met with such TSU officials as President John Rudley, Provost Sunny Ohia, and Vice President Wendy Adair, as well as the deans and other representatives of various schools and colleges at TSU.

In addition, the College hosted for the Minister a reception the guests in which included Dr. Thomas, Freeman, scholars from the College, majors from the Department, and faculty and staff of the University.

The Minister came to TSU with Hon. Kent Hippolyte, the Saint Lucia Consul General in Miami; and Ms. Andrea Jean Baptiste and Mr. Sylvanus Donaie, president and chairperson of the Saint Lucia Association of Texas.

In addition, during his stay in Houston, the Minister visited the Mayor of Houston, Mayor Annise Parker; The Houston Port Authority; the Greater Houston Partnership-Chamber of Commerce; the Houston Police Department; and representatives of the Memorial Hermann Hospital System.

# Honors College Spring 2013 Lecture Series: 'Science, Technology, and the Environment'

For Spring 2013, the focus in the Honors College lecture series will be on a major local, national and global priority - Science, Technology and the Environment.

The first lecture will be on the long history of inquiry or achievement in these areas by People of the African Continent and People of African Descent.

The lecture, Millennia of African Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics and Medicine, will be presented by Dr. Charles S. Finch, the former Director of International Health at Morehouse College.

Two of his major works include The African Background to Medical Science and The Star of Deep Beginnings: The Genesis of African Science and Technology The lecture will be in Room 114 of the School of Public Affairs / College of Liberal Arts and Behavioral Sciences building.

In the second lecture, Dean Robert Bullard of the School of Public Affairs at TSU will speak on Climate Change and Environmental Justice in the Age of Globalization.

Dr. Bullard, called "the father of environmental justice," recently coauthored *The Wrong Complexion* for *Protection*, which describes the government's response to natural and man-made disasters through a social justice and racial equity lens.

The theme also will be the major subject in the third lecture, on The Relationship Between Chronogeography and Health, which Dr. Astatkie Zikarge will present.

He is an assistant professor and an Environmental Health specialist in the Department of Health Sciences at Texas Southern University,

In the fourth lecture, Assistant Dean Karen Kossie-Chernyshev of the Honors College will shed light on her then-newly-published book, Rediscovering Five Generations Hence: The Life and Work of Lillian Jones Horace.

The lectures by Dr. Bullard, Dr. Zikarge and Dr. Kossie-Chernyshev will be in the Honors College Auditorium, in the lower level of the Robert J. Terry Library.
