- Candidates can come from any ethnic background and be male or female.
- Criminal records are handled on case by case bases.

POTENTIAL PARTICIPANTS MUST

Complete application
Take and pass TABE (Test of adult Basic Education)
Individual interview
Attend orientation session
Successfully complete 6 weeks of Power
Skills and 6 weeks of Technical Skills
After completing the program students are fully certified and ready to begin work in the field.
Job placement assistant is provided
