HOUSTON ENDOWMENT AWARDS GRANT TO ESTABLISH THE ROBERT BULLARD CENTER FOR ENVIRONMENTAL AND CLIMATE JUSTICE

The Houston Endowment awarded a grant of \$ 1.25 million to establish the Robert D. Bullard Center for Environmental and Climate Justice at Texas Southern University. The Center will be named in honor of Dr. Robert D. Bullard, University Distinguished Professor of Urban Planning and Environmental Justice. In addition, Dr. Bullard will serve as the Executive Director of the Center. The establishment of the Center is in recognition of Dr. Bullard's invaluable contributions to both knowledge production and praxis about environmental and climate justice.

As part of its mission, the new Center will engage in research, education and civic engagement, especially in underrepresented and marginalized communities, for the purpose of helping to build resilient and sustainable communities, amid the existential threats that are posed by climate change and environmental degradation. Similarly, faith-based organizations and institutions that are committed to the advocacy for equity, and racial and social justice in the era of climate and environmental challenges will receive guidance from the Center in their quest to educate and advocate for policies that promote climate and environmental justice.

CENTER FOR JUSTICE RESEARCH RECEIVED GRANT FROM THE HOUSTON ENDOWMENT

The Center for Justice Research was awarded a grant of \$1.5 million by the Houston Endowment to continue its work on policy relevant research on various aspects of the criminal justice system in the Metro Houston area as well as across the United States. The Center has become a go to research entity to produce policy-relevant recommendations that are designed to help address the major challenges in the criminal justice system, including racial injustice.

TWO BJ-ML SOPA STUDENTS RECEIVED NATIONAL FELLOWSHIPS

Two BJ-M SOPA students received two prestigious national fellowships: Mr. Dexter Maryland, a junior majoring in Political Science, received the White House 2021 HBCU Scholar Award for 2021. Mr. Maryland is one of 86 scholars chosen nation-wide from various HBCUs for their accomplishments in academics, leadership, and civic engagement, among others.

Ms. Janiya Chapman, a junior majoring in Political Science, received the "Porter Hedges LLP Scholarship" for 2021. Ms. Chapman was selected for the award because of her academic achievements, among others.

RESEARCH SHOWCASED IN THE SOPA RESEARCH FORUM

The Research Committee of BJ-ML SOPA organized two sessions under the *SOPA Research* Forum during the spring semester 2021, as part of the efforts to showcase the research of faculty and students in the school:

On April 12, 2021, the *SOPA Research Forum* focused on the topic "I am Not My Hair: The Criminalization of Black Hair."
