## **New Faculty Orientation Program**

The COPHS New Faculty Orientation Program is a year-long program was created to acclimate and support new professors in the College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences to ensure their success. The program is designed to be collaborative and tailored to the specific needs of the COPHS faculty. It is comprised of two components: the initial orientation and a series of monthly sessions on topics that are important for new professors to know in the first year.

The initial orientation takes place within the first week of employment and will take 2 half days. On the first day, faculty will receive an information packet about COPHS and will be introduced to key personnel and procedures that they may need to perform their duties. The second half day will focus on leaning instructional strategies based off of best practices.

The monthly sessions will be an opportunity for the faculty to learn about tools, resources and strategies for successfully navigating their first year.
